The [Landscape Conservation Initiative](#), a partnership-based interdisciplinary research center at Northern Arizona University, seeks a part time temporary staff person to contribute to our [Collaborative Planning](#) program. Current projects are located on the Navajo Nation, and in the Grand Canyon region, northern New Mexico, Green River Basin, and Sonoran desert. Through this program, we assist

multiple agencies and stakeholders collaborating on land management issues including fire, climate adaptation, co-management of lands, habitat protection, and watershed restoration, often using mapping and spatial modeling to help groups reach decisions. The Landscape Conservation Initiative is an inclusive organization that uses rigorous science, innovation, and collaboration to safeguard biodiversity while promoting environmental justice and sustainability.

#### **Environmental Law Institute Report: Regulatory Reform in the Trump Era**

In response to the growing demand for unbiased answers and analysis on how deregulatory initiatives by the new Administration and Congress will impact environmental protection, governance, and the rule of law, ELI has released a special report, [Regulatory Reform in the Trump Era](#). The report explains the legal mechanisms and processes that may get deployed, how they work, and the effect on the current regulatory landscape. It responds to the questions that are increasingly being asked of ELI: What are the pathways and impacts of regulatory reform efforts likely to be undertaken? What are the opportunities for the public and other stakeholders to engage relative to reform initiatives?

#### **Wildland Fire Sensors Challenge**

Six federal agencies have announced a Wildland Fire Sensors Challenge seeking an accurate, lower-cost, and low-maintenance air quality monitoring system that can be used during a wildfire or controlled fire. The data provided by the sensor system will help federal, state, local and tribal agencies protect the health of first responders and communities affected by the smoke.

Developers are encouraged to submit a prototype sensor system that

measures fine particulate matter (PM<sub>2.5</sub>), carbon monoxide (CO), ozone (O<sub>3</sub>) and carbon dioxide (CO<sub>2</sub>). The system should be capable of rapid deployment and continuous real-time monitoring of highly dynamic air pollution levels during a fire event. Developers should also aim for designs that are easy to use and self-powered; include location data; and wirelessly transmit data to a central data-receiving station.

Written submissions are due by **Nov. 22, 2017** and prototypes must be submitted by **Jan. 5, 2018**. The sensor systems will be evaluated in government specialty labs based on 1) accuracy over a wide range of pollutant levels, 2) system cost, and 3) operation requirements relevant for wildland fire deployment. All developers who submit prototypes will receive direct feedback on laboratory tests and end user review.

The Challenge total award pool is \$60,000, which may be awarded in total to one winner if all the requirements are met, or divided into several partial awards. Prize winner(s) will be selected following the conclusion of judging in summer 2018.

**EPA Issues Request for Proposals (RFP) for FY17 and FY18 Tribal Wetland Program Development Grants. Proposals are due June 5, 2017.**

Wetland Program Development Grants (WPDGs) assist state, tribal, local government (S/T/LG) agencies and interstate/intertribal entities in developing or refining state/tribal/local programs which protect, manage, and restore wetlands. The primary focus of these grants is to develop/refine state/tribal wetland programs. EPA has issued a RFP soliciting proposals from eligible applicants to develop or refine tribal wetland programs. Tribes and intertribal consortia are eligible to apply under this announcement. Non-profit organizations are not eligible to compete under this RFP. The total amount of federal funding available under this announcement is approximately \$2,644,800 (\$1,191,800 expected from FY17 and \$1,453,000 expected from FY18) depending on Agency funding levels, which may vary from year to year, and other applicable considerations. Awards will likely range from \$25,000 to \$300,000 in federal funds. It is anticipated that the assistance agreements awarded under this announcement will have one- to four-year project periods starting after October 1, 2017. The project period for assistance agreements under this announcement may be no more than four years. EPA's Office of Transportation and Air Quality is soliciting proposals nationwide for projects that achieve significant reductions in diesel emissions in terms of tons of pollution produced by diesel engines and diesel emissions exposure, particularly from fleets operating at or servicing goods movement facilities located in areas designated as having poor air quality. Further, priority for funding may be given to projects which result in outcomes that benefit affected communities, those that engage affected communities with respect to the design and performance of the project, and those which can demonstrate the ability to promote and continue

efforts to reduce emissions after the project has ended. Eligible entities include regional, state, or local agencies, tribal governments (or intertribal consortia) and native villages, or port authorities, which have jurisdiction over transportation or air quality, and nonprofit organizations or institutions that: a) represent or provide pollution reduction or educational services to persons or organizations that own or operate diesel fleets or b) have, as their principal purpose, the promotion of transportation or air quality.

#### **Free Technical Assistance to Communities for Brownfields Sites EPA Region 9 Targeted Brownfields Assessment Program Soft Deadline – June 9, 2017**

EPA provides contractor assistance to research historic property uses, conduct environmental sampling and identify cleanup options and cost estimates. By submitting a short, on-line application, public entities, nonprofits and tribes can access up to \$100,000 worth of technical assistance for eligible sites. At no cost to the applicant, EPA contractors evaluate whether a property is contaminated and provide follow-up recommendations.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is excited to announce the availability of \$11 million in Diesel Emission Reduction Program (DERA) funds to support projects aimed at reducing emissions from the nation's existing fleet of older diesel engines. Under this competition, between 20 and 80 awards are anticipated to be made to eligible applicants.

Eligible applicants include regional, state, local or tribal agencies, or port authorities, with jurisdiction over transportation or air quality. Nonprofit organizations may apply if they provide pollution reduction or educational services to diesel fleet owners or have, as their principal purpose, the promotion of transportation or air quality.
